

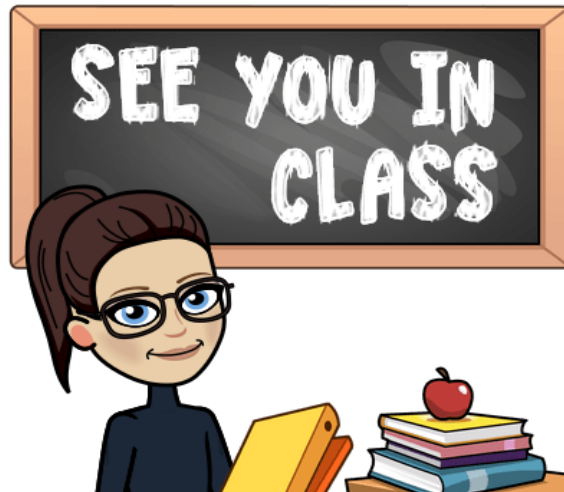

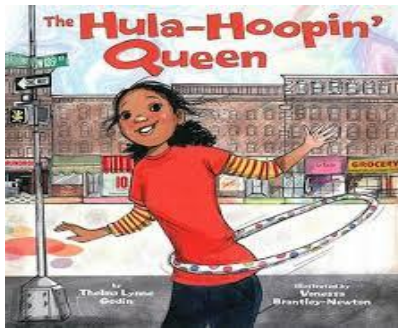
Students are creating and sharing writing in the following genres: personal narrative, opinion, informational and procedural... today and every day
