Continuing to collaborate and work with our community partners, the Kindergarten Success

Academy was escorted on a Unity Day walk by Police Chief Stacey Williams and other members of the Roselle Police Department.

"Led by our guidance counselor, Ms. Chantae Benson, the entire school population along with parents, Board of Education member Yessica Chavez, and the Roselle Police walked the neighborhood chanting 'united against bullying' and returned to the parking lot where we all took a pledge to be a **'Buddy and not a Bully,'**" said Principal Sheila Williams.



Students at Dr. Charles C. Polk Elementary School also got a special visit from the Roselle Police Department last week. Officers Edourad and Reyes spoke to students about being safe in and around the school. They talked about what to do when children encounter dangerous situations and who to call when they are in trouble.

"Polk students and staff would like to thank Officer Edourad and Office Reyes for their time," said Principal Melissa Allison. "The officers provided our students with a very important message."

Students at Leonard V. Moore Middle School also took a stand against bullying by sporting orange clothing in support of bully prevention for Unity Day.



On the gridiron, the Roselle Rams are finishing the fall season strong! Football continued its impressive turnaround as Nafee Finney ran for 108 yards and Emmanuel Lyles chipped in with 93 yards in a convincing 47-6 win over Bound Brook. Boys soccer picked up two wins and a loss defeating Edison Academy 1-0, losing to Brearley 3-0 and bouncing back to take down Thomas Edison Energy Smart Charter School, 7-0, last week. Meanwhile, our volleyball team defeated Thomas Energy Smart Charter School in straight sets, 2-0, but dropped a tough match to Asbury Park, 2-1.

Wilday Soccer continued to be impressive in its inaugural season but the undefeated season came to an end with a 4-2 loss at Union Avenue Middle School of Irvington. Our young soccer team then bounced back strong with back-to-back 2-1 wins over South River and Elizabeth South.
